Upcoming WHS Change – Silica Worker Register (effective 1 October 2025)

From **1 October 2025**, amendments to the *Work Health and Safety Regulation 2025* will introduce new obligations for businesses that undertake high-risk processing of crystalline silica substances (CSS).

SafeWork NSW will establish a **Silica Worker Register**, requiring persons conducting a business or undertaking (PCBUs) to register all workers involved in high-risk silica processing activities, including tunnelling, cutting, grinding, or polishing materials containing crystalline silica.

Failure to provide the required information may result in a penalty notice offence.

Key Information Required:

PCBUs must submit prescribed information to the Register, including:

- Details of workers carrying out high-risk silica processing
- Information about the PCBU
- The type of silica processing being conducted (including tunnelling where relevant)
- Health monitoring information provided to workers

The **Workers Compensation (Dust Diseases) Authority** will also have access to the Register for monitoring health obligations.

What this means for you?

If your organisation undertakes activities involving crystalline silica, you will need to:

- Identify and register workers in the online portal from 1 October 2025
- Ensure health monitoring obligations are met
- Update WHS systems and records to align with the new legislation
